Anne Frank's background

Anne Frank was born June 12, 1929 in Frankfurt, Germany. Her childhood was great and cheerful until the German Nazis came to power, led by Adolf Hitler. He thought Jews were bad people and should be killed. Anne and her family were Jewish and were forced into hiding with another family. They went into hiding in her father Otto Frank's office building for two years until they were discovered by the Nazis and taken away to a concentration camp. While in the secret annex, Anne wrote in her diary almost everyday. Her diary's name was Kitty.

Anne Frank's background

Anne Frank didn't make it past 15 years old so she was not able to have kids or get married.

She went through the Holocaust. Hitler was the leader of Germany and he had the Nazis evict all Jews and held them in concentration camps. Although Anne and her family were German they went by Jewish religions. After hiding for two years she and her family went to a concentration camp and they were forced to work for 21 hours straight each day with very little food. Since they were found in hiding, they were convicted as criminals. The concentration camps were not only for working. They were basically death camps and if you were not healthy enough to work you were gassed, tortured and killed

Anne Frank's background

Her parents technically influenced her because they got her the diary on her thirteenth birthday. They also raised her to be smart, brave and loving.

Anne Frank did not make it past fifteen so she did not have a very long life. When her and her family were captured, they spent time in several different camps. The family was eventually separated from her father. Anne and her sister Margot got very sick with Typhoid. Her mother visited them the sick house, but eventually died. Margot fell off her bed and was too weak to survive. She also died. Anne thought her whole family was dead so she gave up and let herself die slowly also.

Anne had short curly brown hair, green eyes, and she always dressed very proper.
