

## Subject and Object Pronouns

A **subject pronoun** is used in the subject of a sentence.

Singular subject pronouns are I, you, he, she, it

Plural subject pronouns are we, you, they

When you use a person's name and a pronoun in a compound subject, be sure to use a subject pronoun.

**Examples** He has many original ideas.  
They are exciting and unusual.  
Mom and I made bird feeders.

An **object pronoun** is used in the predicate of a sentence after an action verb or with a preposition, such as for, at, into, with, or to.

Singular object pronouns are me, you, him, her, it.

Plural object pronouns are us, you, them.

When you use a person's name and a pronoun in a compound object, be sure to use an object pronoun.

**Examples** The teacher asked him about his project.  
It seemed brilliant to me.  
This project was fun for James and me.
